1. Introduction

- 1.1. Buckinghamshire Council serves a population of just over 550,000 people across an area of almost 1,900 km².
- 1.2. One of Buckinghamshire Council's priorities is to produce a Local Plan for Buckinghamshire (LP4B) to update and replace the former Local plans covering the council area. The new LP4B is intended to shape the direction of growth throughout the new unitary area over to 2045. To produce an up-to-date local plan the council needs an up-to-date evidence base. As part of this work the council has undertaken a Community Facility Study. This study will form part of the evidence base that is necessary to ensure the LP4B will be robust and justifiable, and that it will help to shape a sustainable future for Buckinghamshire.

2. Purpose of Study

- 2.1 The Community Facilities Study assesses the amount of community facilities that currently exist to serve the council's residents. The aim is to provide an up-to-date picture of services and community infrastructure in the council area. The information gathered will be used to inform the emerging spatial strategy for the LP4B. It will also aid development management officers in considering applications to remove community facilities or to provide new facilities. The study will also be used by the Council's communities' team to assess future needs for community facilities and or to assess possible future funding programs to improve community provision.
- 2.2 The study will not identify specific shortfalls in provision of community facilities as there are no set standards for the amount, type, or size of community facilities. Each community and each type of community use has developed community facilities over the years, and each settlement has different community needs. Future development to meet the housing and employment needs of the area is likely to require the provision of new community facilities to meet the needs of the new residents. The overall level of new development in Buckinghamshire, and its location, will be determined by taking into account a wide range of evidence studies and other policy documents which will be brought together in the new LP4B. It will contribute to the development of the Infrastructure Development Plan that will support the LP4B.

3. National Planning policy definition of community facilities

- 3.1 National Planning Policy is set out in the National Planning Policy

Framework¹ (NPPF) and associated Planning Practice Guidance (PPG). The NPPF states that planning should ensure provision of healthy, inclusive and safe places which offer opportunities for social interaction and provision of local facilities to encourage healthier living.

- 3.2 Specifically in relation to community facilities the guidance states that Councils should plan positively for the provision and use of shared spaces, community facilities (such as local shops, meeting places, sports venues, open space, cultural buildings, public houses and places of worship) and other local services and that they should guard against the unnecessary loss of valued facilities and services, ensure that established shops, facilities and services are able to develop and modernise, and are retained for the benefit of the community; and ensure an integrated approach to considering the location of housing, economic uses and community facilities and services.²
- 3.3 National guidance makes other references to community facilities such as in relation to education in the planning practice guidance but there is no national definition of what constitutes a community facility leaving that to be determined by the local planning authority.

4. Explanation of community facilities included in study

4.1

- a. As explained above, there is no national definition of a community facility, in general terms any building or facility that serves the community could be regarded as a community facility. However, without a definition it's difficult to consistently apply planning policies particularly in relation to the potential loss of an existing community facility.
- b. Community facilities are provided by a variety of organisations. For example, a community village hall/building may be provided by a council (parish or County), a community group such as a faith group or other local organisation and or a specific group/association that runs the building e.g. Village Hall society/committee. Other facilities may be provided commercially such as a village pub or shop but still serve a local community.
- c. Community facilities can serve the immediate population, for example a village hall will serve the population of the village where it is located. Other community facilities may serve a wider area. For example, a community library or leisure

centers would serve a much wider area. Many community buildings, although located in a particular settlement, will hire out space to users who don't live locally but need space for their party or other event. This mix of community provision makes it difficult to plan for and or assess community needs across the district.

- d. As explained above, community uses can include many types of building and many types of uses; some community facilities are linked more to sports provision or open space provision rather than a community building use. For clarity, this study includes the following community uses:
- Community/ Meeting Hall*
 - Faith Building
 - Pub
 - Community/local shop
 - Libraries
 - Youth group meeting venue (e.g. scouts, Guides, youth club)
- e. The following, although accepted as being community uses, are covered by the council's Infrastructure Delivery Plan. This is because these types of uses are governed by specific requirements which may mean the provision although serving a local community may be offered via a facility in another area or serving a wider area or may in the view of the provider be better if provided by a bigger facility.
- Schools
 - Health Provision
 - Cemeteries/Crematoria
- f. Other types of community use not listed above may be covered by the council's other evidence studies such as the Playing Pitch Strategy (PPS) covering marked out playing pitches, or the Wider Sports Study covering play areas, recreation grounds and public open spaces. The mix of community type uses and the use of sports facilities by community groups other than sports teams, means that there will be some overlap between the uses covered by this study and the other studies mentioned. To aid understanding of what type of facility is covered by which study there is a table in appendix A listing the types of community/sport/open space use and the study that they are covered by. The overlap of uses means that in some cases the studies may need to be used together to assess provision.

5. Community Facilities study purposes

- 5.1 The Community Facilities Study has five key functions. To:

1. Inform policies (including site allocation policies) in the emerging Local Plan
 - I. Help update and corroborate the settlement hierarchy for the emerging Local Plan
 - II. Be a point of reference for planning applications that propose the loss, gain or alteration of a community facility
 - III. Be a point of reference for planning applications for development sites that consider or propose inclusion of community facilities.
 - IV. Provide evidence for consideration of CIL and S106 applications.
2. National planning guidance as set out above states that local planning authorities should plan positively for the provision of community facilities and guard against their loss. This study provides the council with evidence of the amount and type of community facilities that exist and so helps to inform the policies in the local plan for Buckinghamshire.
3. As explained below, this study builds on the evidence collected for the Settlement Review study to help establish a settlement hierarchy for the local plan.
4. Having an up-to-date evidence study of the existing community facilities throughout the council area can help planning officers assess planning applications that may propose the loss of existing community facilities and the provision of new Community facilities or alterations to an existing community facility. The study can also be used as evidence where planning applications for larger developments include the provision of new community facilities as part of the wider development proposals.
5. Community Infrastructure funding or section 106 money could be used to improve existing community facilities, provide more capacity at existing facilities or be channeled towards the provision of new community facilities where the respective councils consider this is an area to spend their allocated Community Infrastructure funding.

6. Methodology

- 6.1 It was decided that information about community services across Buckinghamshire had already been gathered by work undertaken during the council's Buckinghamshire Settlement Review study as such it was considered that data gathered by the Settlement Review work could act as a reference point. This study builds on this initial data source. See the council's Settlement Review study for details of how the initial data on settlement facilities was gathered.
- 6.2 In early 2025, all parishes and town councils were re-contacted as part of a wider data-gathering exercise and asked for any updates to the data originally provided for

the Settlement Review. A copy of the email text is attached at Appendix B. An assumption was made that where parishes did not respond, the data already held from the previous assessment was correct. A copy of the responses in relation to community facilities is attached at Appendix C.

7. Summary and conclusions

- 7.1 It is clear from the community facilities assessment that there are a lot of community facilities spread out across Buckinghamshire. These facilities are clustered more in the main towns and larger settlements. However, from the survey results it can be seen that most settlements have at least one community facility. However, how useful that community facility is to each settlement will depend on many factors including the use the facility was originally designed for and the level of access to the facility.
- 7.2 Whilst knowing the number of community facilities will be helpful for future planning both in terms of the provision of new facilities but also in terms of seeking to protect existing community use of the facilities, more qualitative information about the condition of the facilities also needs to be taken into account. This level of detail may come through adoption of a Neighbourhood Plan or may be gathered through further specific community surveys and or evidence produced through the planning application process.

8. Review

- 8.1 The council is aware that any survey of facilities will only be correct at the point the survey is undertaken. The result is that the study results will become out of date over time as different community uses are created or existing community buildings change their use or become unused. The council is keen to keep the information it holds up to date this will ensure that both the council has up-to-date evidence for the local plan but also has an up-to-date picture when assessing the need for community facilities to be protected or for additional community facilities. Therefore, the council intends to review the community facilities study on an annual basis with a re-survey of parishes which may over time include additional questions to add detail to the community facility information held.
